Bockstie among eight athletes selected to represent Junior Team USA at 2024 IBF World Youth Championships in Korea

ARLINGTON, Texas – Eight talented young bowlers, including NCAUSBCA member Jake Bockstie of Nottingham, Md., will have the opportunity to make their dreams of representing the United States on the lanes come true after having been chosen by the National Selection Committee to represent Junior Team USA at the 2024 International Bowling Federation World Youth Championships in Incheon, Korea.

The group will be led by Team USA Coach Kelly Kulick, a USBC Hall of Famer and head coach of Junior Team USA. She will be assisted by USBC and NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer Kendra Cameron-Curry, USBC Program Director-High Performance.

The 2024 World Youth Championships will run from July 7-18 at Incheon's Fiesta Bowling Center.

The World Youth Championships will be Junior Team USA's second competition of 2024 following the IBF Youth World Cup in Lima, Peru in January.

EIGHT INDUCTED INTO USBC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2024

The eight members of the 2024 United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame class were celebrated during their induction ceremony April 24 at South Point Hotel and Casino. Missy Parkin of San Clemente, California; Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, South Carolina; and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Illinois were inducted in the Superior Performance category. Debbie Kuhn of Abingdon, Maryland; Jodi Woessner of Oregon, Ohio; and Brian Waliczek of Frankenmuth, Michigan were inducted in the USBC Outstanding Performance category. Roy Buckley of Columbus, Ohio was inducted in the Veterans category and Darlene Baker of Mahomet, Illinois was inducted in the Meritorious Service category. Five of the eight members of the 2024 class were in attendance for the ceremony. Buckley, who died in 2021 at the age of 77, was inducted posthumously. Jones and Rash were competing in the Professional Bowlers Association's Tournament of Champions in Fairlawn, Ohio. Including the 2024 class, there are 460 members of the USBC Hall of Fame - 233 in Superior Performance, 127 in Meritorious Service, 55 in Veterans, 23 in Outstanding USBC Performance, and 22 in Pioneer. The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame. BVL SEEKS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), bowling's own and oldest charity, based out of Fairfax, Va., seeks an executive director who will be responsible for the daily operation of BVL. The position oversees all fund-raising and grant approvals as well as assisting the board with board meetings and oversee BVL's role in the National Veteran's Day ceremony in Washington, D.C. each November. This full-time position, which reports to Chairman of the BVL Board Nancy Schenk, requires the executive director to oversee all BVL ambassadors, and it may require overseeing bookkeeper, assistant, and audit as needed. Compensation paid commensurate on experience (range: \$65,000 to \$85,000). Paid time off and vacation. Travel takes up approximately 4-5 weeks total per year. Did your officers perform their duties to benefit the league?

Hello, Bowlers:

The bowling season is coming to an end. I hope your league and its members had a great season. League officers are performing end-of-season activities, and bowlers are planning their summer activities.

Let's hope your end-of-season activities went well and league presidents verified that (1) Secretaries provided the final league standings to the league treasurer and submitted the bowlers' final averages to the Nation's Capital USBC Association office within 15 days of the end of the season; (2) Ensured the league treasurer paid out according to the prize fund and distributed the final financial report.

Did your league officers perform their duties to benefit the league? Was the election of league officers conducted according to the 2023-2024 USBC *Playing Rules*? Bowlers should feel confident that league officers managed the league by performing all duties as required. When you cast your vote for these officers, choose the best person for the job. Officers who do their jobs efficiently contribute to keeping their leagues operating well and bowlers happy.

There are still spots available for our NCAUSBCA 78th Annual Open Championships Tournament. The dates are June 15-16, 22-23, and 29-30, 2024. The team event will be at The Lanes Fort Meade, while Crofton

Bowling Centre is the singles and doubles house.

Summer is just around the corner, and bowling is a great way to beat the heat and stay active. Bowling centers will have the air conditioning cranked up high, so consider joining a summer league, bowling in tournaments, or practicing to adjust your stance, grip, and release to improve your game. Check your local center to see if an adult-youth league is starting this summer. Adults are needed to partner with youth bowlers. Youth leagues need coaches and volunteers. It's a great way to give back to our youth.

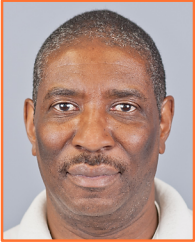

Season-ending items

For most, the winter 2023-2024 season is over. As a reminder, final averages must be submitted to the association office no later than 15 days after the league is over. It is *not* the bowling center's responsibility to submit the averages but the secretary's.

The inclusion of Bowler ID numbers is crucial, as they help us make sure scores are credited to the correct bowler. We can send you a fillable average request form that will have all of the Bowler IDs listed — just eMail a request to *manager@ncausbca.org* or *bowlmag@hotmail.com*.

We have received a few submissions with nicknames, and this, along with added names that are misspelled, and juniors & seniors within the same family who are not identified as such are reasons why the Bowler ID number is so important. In any case, league secretaries are *required* to supply this number along with the pins, games, and average. You soon can check our Web page for leagues for which we have not received final averages.

Are you a Triple Crown winner? This is an award given to the male and/or female bowler who had the highest average, scratch game, and scratch series — all three! — in a league.

If you plan to bowl in a summer league, there are a few things to be aware of. If you need to purchase a membership for the summer season, you have two options: (1) a Basic membership costs \$11.00

and is only good for membership in a league designated as a Basic (16 weeks or less) league. You will need to purchase a membership for each league you decide to join. (2) Standard membership costs \$26.00 and is good for multiple leagues. Memberships will expire at summer's end or when the league ends. Further, with a Basic membership, you will not be eligible for any awards except for honor score awards from USBC.

The NCAUSBCA 78th Annual Open Championships Tournament will be held the last three weekends in June this year. The team event will be held at The Lanes Fort Meade, and the singles/doubles event will be at Crofton Bowling Centre.

There are many options to make money: crossover doubles, 50+ singles and all-events, and scratch events. Please note that this tournament pays at least one in six places, unlike many tournaments that pay one out of every 10 places, plus 90 percent of the fee paid for optional events goes directly into the prize fund. Come out and bowl, this is *your* City tournament, and we are happy to say that we will be in Crofton for the first time in several years.

Interested in helping out at your tournaments? Email me and we will add you to our signup genius link. We always need help with fund-raisers, collecting scores, check-in, and brackets.

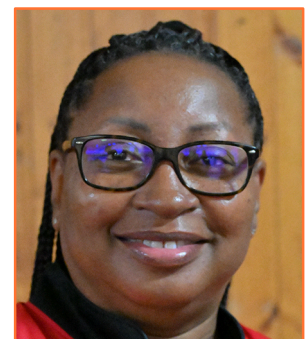

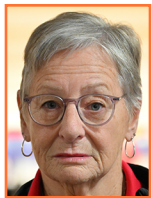

No bylaws / rules amendments considered at 2024 USBC Convention and Annual Meeting

LAS VEGAS – Delegates elected three board members, attended a variety of educational seminars, and were on hand for a celebration of Glenn Allison during a jam-packed 2024 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting, which concluded April 25 at South Point Hotel, Casino, and Spa.

The ballot for the USBC Board election originally had four candidates slated by the USBC Nominating Committee. However, one candidate withdrew from consideration prior to the convention, leaving Dennis Hacker of Longtown, Missouri; Chrissy Lee of Tampa, Florida; and Matthew Voltz of Fargo, North Dakota as the final candidates for the board.

With three candidates for three open positions, all three were confirmed to the board in a vote by acclamation of the delegates. The board also announced the appointments of Hacker as president and Mike Cannington of Fort Myers, Florida as vice president. Each

will serve two-year terms in those roles beginning Aug. 1, 2024.

Team USA athletes elected David Haynes of Las Vegas and Matt Russo of Ballwin, Missouri to the USBC Board, and the Athletes Advisory Committee filled a vacant board position by appointing Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio. Additionally, Christopher Floyd of Lockport, Louisiana was re-elected by the IBC Youth Committee to the USBC Board.

The new board members begin their three-year terms Aug. 1, 2024.

Convention week kicked off with exhibits and a trade show Monday, April 22, followed by a welcome reception for the delegates that evening. Day 2 got off to an energetic start when keynote speaker Marvelous Mark delivered a “rockstar themed” speech that had the delegates completely engaged while banging on drumsticks.

Tuesday continued with numerous educational seminars throughout the day and concluded with a fun-filled “Game Show” night for the delegates.

Wednesday featured the conclusion of the educational seminars in the morning, and a “Meet the Candidates” session for USBC Board candidates to start the afternoon.

Following the Meet the Candidates session, the first session of the Annual Meeting took place. That Wednesday afternoon session was highlighted by presentations from USBC charity partners Bowlers

to Veterans Link (BVL), which provides recreational and therapeutic programs and services to America’s active duty and veteran service men and women, and Bowl for the Cure®, the year-round fundraising initiative sponsored by USBC in partnership with Susan G. Komen®.

Thursday featured the final two sessions of the Annual Meeting. The presentation of Youth and National Recognition Awards took place during the morning session, including the Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award to Melia Mitskavich of DuBois, Pennsylvania and the Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow Award to William Smith of Smyrna, Tennessee.

Space Coast USBC (Brevard County Florida) was awarded the Association Excellence Award. USBC board member Glenda Beckett of Palmetto Bay, Florida, who also serves on the USBC Awards and Recognition Committee, surprised the Space Coast USBC delegates as part of the ceremony.

The morning session concluded with a report from USBC Board President Melissa McDaniel, followed by a series of committee reports, including presentations from the Strategic Planning Committee and from International Bowling Campus Youth Development.

The Business Report was delivered by Deputy Executive Director Jason Overstreet and, among other things, detailed the continuation of the USBC’s “Why I Certify” brand awareness campaign with all new stories to share from USBC members. The Annual Meeting continued in the afternoon with the Executive Director's report from Chad Murphy. The highlight of Murphy's presentation was a tribute to USBC Hall of Famer Glenn Allison. Allison of Corona, California set the participation record at the USBC Open Championships with his 72nd appearance in the event in February.

After a video tribute, Allison received a standing ovation from the delegates as USBC President Melissa McDaniel presented him with a commemorative gold, diamond, and black onyx ring with the number "72" inscribed in it.

Following Murphy's presentation, the meeting moved into the election and legislative segments. Board elections went as described above, and there were no proposed bylaw nor rules amendments for the delegates to consider this year.

In other news from Convention week, the International Bowling Campus Youth Committee announced Seth Kettelsen of DeWitt, Iowa; Cody McCormick of Norwalk, Iowa; Sarah Nygaard of Lakeville, Minnesota; and Chris Pittard of San Antonio, Texas as its newest committee members.

The Convention concluded with an April 25 afternoon town hall meeting hosted by Murphy.

In 2025, the USBC Convention will return to South Point Hotel, Casino, and Spa in Las Vegas in conjunction with the USBC Women's Championships, with the event scheduled to run from May 5-8.

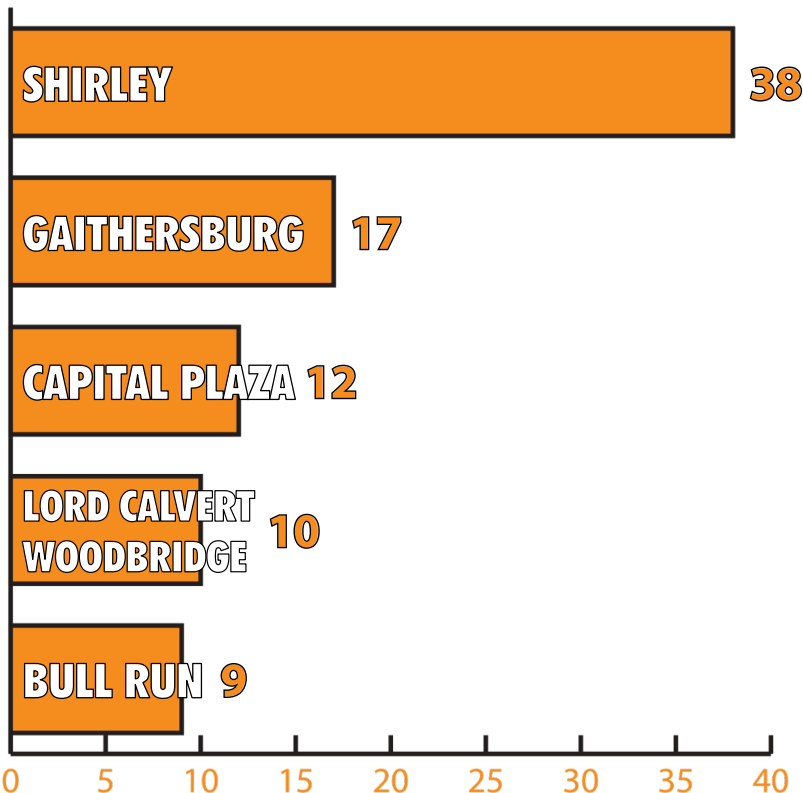
